INTRODUCTION

The Diploma in Arts (Adult Guidance Counselling) is designed to serve as a training course for people working with adults in a guidance counselling setting, providing information, advice guidance and placement services.

The emphasis of the course is on the development of the key communication and relationship skills and competencies that underpin the practice of Adult Guidance.

The course also aims to work towards the development of an understanding of core concepts and ideas concerning marginalisation, exclusion and adult career development. The personal development and self awareness of the participants underpins the course.

Case Review and Professional Development 1 AD02FA

This module offers an opportunity to reflect on casework in a small group setting in the light of core concepts and theories encountered on the course.

Adult Guidance Counselling Skills 1 AD02DA

This module focusses on the core communications and interpersonal approaches and skills that underpin adult guidance counselling. The module will develop participants' capacity to establish a professional relationship

with clients in terms of contract and boundary setting.

The Reflective Learner and Reflective Practice 1 AD02EA

This module provides an opportunity for participants to engage mindfully and reflexively with their own experience of learning on the course in the light of the theoretical models encountered on the course.

Year 2

Case Review and Professional Development 2 AD02FB

This module builds on and deepens the supervisory model from year 1, to strengthen participants capacity to develop professional practice in adult guidance and counselling.

Adult Guidance and Counselling Skills 2 AD02DBA

This module provides an advanced engagement with models of guidance counselling including a capacity to critique oneself ethically and professionally.

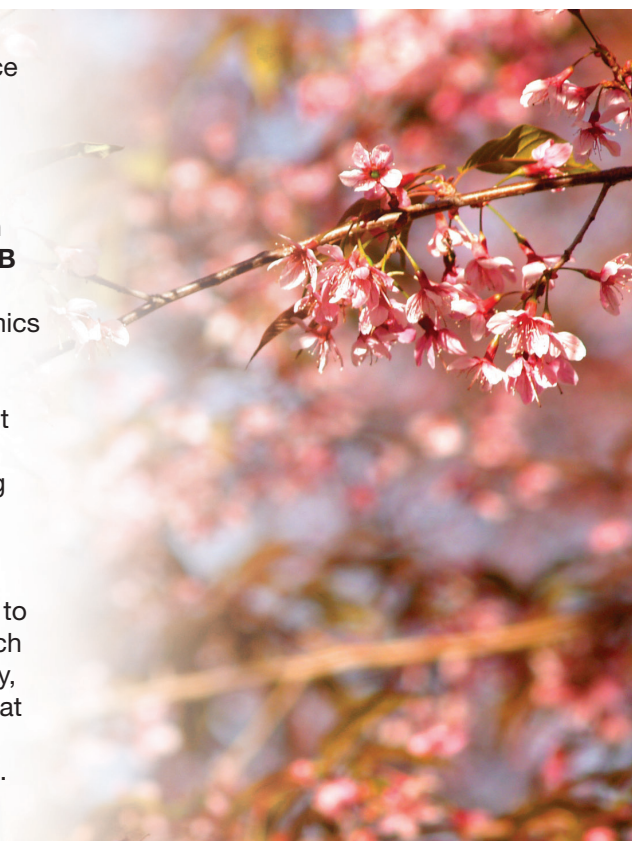

Research Methodologies in Adult Guidance Counselling AD02C

This module introduces participants to methods of practitioner research such as narrative inquiry, autoethnography, action research and other models that are congruent with a transformative learning approach to adult guidance.

The Reflective Learner and Reflective Practice 2 AD02EB

This Module offers an opportunity for participants to engage reflexively with their own learning on the course and to deepen their capacities to take responsibility for the development of their own professional identity and practice.



Admission Requirement

- Applicants will be expected to have a minimum of two years' experience working with adults in a developmental setting and be seeing a minimum of 6 clients on a regular basis
- Applicants should have participated in training courses or workshops in the area of guidance, counselling and self-awareness;
- Interview with Staff in the Department

Assessment Methods

Participants are required to have a minimum attendance of 80%. A range of assessment methods will be used on the course as follows:

- Skills Application: Twice a year participant are required to submit a recorded interview together with a written commentary. Participants' skills will be monitored on an ongoing basis
- Portfolio: A portfolio of home based learning activities
- Essay/Research: One essay over the course and a research project
- A learning statement at the end of each year
- Case Presentation: Two Case Studies presented to peers

Course Durations

The Diploma is delivered part-time over two years in an open learning format, incorporating e-learning material, and workshops.

The workshops will be provided over 1 x 3 days and 7 x 2-day sessions each year and one summer week-long psychometric testing workshop. Participants will be required to attend one workshop per month. Which will take place on Thursday/Friday, 9.30am – 5.00pm
