0	Follow the instructions given.	True or False Questions Tips:			
0	Read the instructions for each question carefully e.g. 'Mark one correct answer', or you might be asked to 'Mark all correct answers.'	-Read the statement very carefully. -If EVERY part of the statement is true, the answer is true.			
0	Cover up the possible responses and anticipate the correct response before seeing the other options.	 -If only ONE part is false, the answer is false. -Look out for negatives eg, 'It is not the case that' 			
0	If you see the response that you anticipated check to make sure that none of the other responses are better.	 Take care with comparative statements eg, 'X is more likely when Y than when Z.' Look out for words like 'always' and 'never.' 			
о	If unsure, skip it and come back later.	- LOOK OUT TOT WOTUS TIKE always and never.
