




THE NETWORK




SAR EUROPE

Launch of SAR Europe, European Parliament, Brussels, November 2018



- Scholars at Risk (SAR) Europe is hosted at Maynooth University, reflecting the shared commitment to the principle of Academic Freedom
- SAR Europe supports national SAR sections in 11 European countries & coordinates the 10-partner H2020 project; <u>Inspireurope</u>
- Aim to strengthen collective voice & contribute to informed policymaking at European Level.

SECTION BENEFITS

- ✓ Pooling resources (financial and human) to protect scholars
- ✓ Sharing and deepening of expertise on hosting, advocacy and valuespromotion
- ✓ Access to support networks: within national sections, between sections, across global network
- ✓ Stronger voice / representation on the International Advisory Committee
- ✓ Increases likelihood of sustainability.
- ✓ Invited to nominate a representative to SAR's International Advisory Committee



National Sections: Model structures

- National secretariat e.g. SAR Germany (w/Humboldt Foundation), SAR Finland (w/Universities Finland (UNIFI)
- **2. Steering committee & Chair** e.g. SAR Norway., 5 to 7 reps elected to serve on steering committee for 2 years
- 3. Partner NGO: e.g. UK (Cara), Netherlands (UAF) where both organisations have a long history supporting refugee and atrisk populations



PROPOSED NEXT STEPS IN GREECE



- Discuss and agree with SAR possibilities for future coordination of SAR section in Greece:
 - Steering committee of member universities, with 1 institution as Chair?
 - National secretariat?
 - Partner NGO?
- Draft Memorandum of Understanding (2 years) between SAR & new coordinator/Chair to agree on a structure, roles and responsibilities (SAR can share model MOU)
- 3. One formed, national sections can nominate rep to SAR's International Advisory Committee (IAC)
- 4. Ongoing communication & coordination w/SAR's office (Europe & US) & national secretariat/steering committee.
