Persons entering the campus do so at their own risk.

At various times, access may be restricted to designated areas.

The grounds are closed at Christmas and at other times as designated by the owners.

These rules may be updated or altered for operational reasons at any time.

*All Gates are closed during the Christmas Break and may be closed for operational reasons at certain times throughout the year.

DRIVING:

- Campus Speed limit is 25 kmph.
- Vehicles using the campus must comply with the Road Traffic Act.
- Touring around the grounds in your car is not permitted.
- Coaches may only be brought to campus by prior arrangement with the Traffic Office (01 7086937).

PARKING:

- Parking is managed by permits (for staff and students).
- Visitor parking is pay and display, and is exclusively for persons with business in the campus.
- Vehicles may only be parked in designated parking spaces and are parked at owner's risk.
- Please check the signage in the car park to ensure you have parked in an appropriate space.
- Vehicles left unattended for more than three weeks will be deemed abandoned and may be removed.
- Wheel clamping is used to facilitate parking management on campus.
- Clamp release fee is indicated by signage in the car parks.
- Motorbikes must be parked inside the main gate by the bicycle racks.
- Camper vans and Caravans are prohibited on campus.



TRANSPORT

The Campus is well served by public transport

- Bicycles / E-Bicycles / Scooters / E-Scooters must be parked in the bicycle racks provided.
- Bicycles / E-Bicycles / Scooters / E-Scooters attached to trees, railings or handrails will be removed.
- Bicycles / E-Bicycles / Scooters / E-Scooters may not be brought into buildings and are not permitted to be charged in buildings.
- Bicycles / E-Bicycles / Scooters / E-Scooters left unattended for more than three weeks will be deemed abandoned and may be removed. The campus has pedestrian zones. Bicycles / E-Bicycles / Scooters / E-Scooters must be walked in these areas.

SCOOTERS

- Sports may only be played in designated facilities.
- The use of sports facilities is generally restricted to staff and students.
- Sports facilities may be booked through the Sports Centre.

RECREATION

- Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times. Dogs are not allowed on playing pitches.
- Dog dirt is a health hazard; owners must always clean up after their dogs
- ✓ Children must be supervised by an adult at all times.

PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

The following are strictly prohibited on campus:

- Skateboarding
- BMX biking • Picnics and barbecues on the grounds
- Camping
- Dumping: fly tippers will be prosecuted
- Rollerblading
- Consumption of alcohol, except in designated areas
- Littering

NATIONAL

The National Seminary is located on Maynooth Campus

- Visitors to any of the Seminary Buildings, Saint Joseph's Square, the College Chapel, the oratories and the Bi-Centenary Garden should be suitably attired, and behave at all times in a dignified manner, appropriate to a place of prayer or worship.
- Saint Joseph's Square is the formal garden of the College. Please keep off the grass. The Bi-Centenary Garden is a place for quiet prayer and reflection. This space is not suitable for recreational activities or sunbathing. An atmosphere of quiet and calm is to be maintained at all times. This garden and the Parkland at the rear of the College are of particular sensitivity to the Seminary. Please stay on the paths. Access will be denied during Retreat Days and other designated times.
