





Studying abroad allows you to spend a semester or a year at one of our **Partner Universities** through one of our **exchange** programmes.






Why Study Abroad?

BA/BBS/BCL

3rd Year

Go abroad for the full academic year and complete your 4th and final year in MU.

3-year degree becomes a 4-year International degree.

Must register for 60 ECTS and pass a minimum of 45 ECTS. If you fail your year abroad, your degree reverts to the original degree.

You should discuss any specific module requirements with your International Coordinator. All modules must be approved by your International Coordinator.



3rd Year LLB Go abroad for the full academic year taking law related courses. You must pass 60 ECTS credits of approved law related modules. All modules must be approved by the MU International Coordinator in the Department of Law. You should discuss suitable places and options with your International Coordinator.



BSc/BEd

3rd Year

BSc - it may be possible to study abroad for one semester or the full academic year depending on your course.

BEd - it may be possible to study abroad for one semester (first semester).

You should discuss suitable places and options with your International Coordinator and Programme Director(s). All modules must be approved by your International Coordinator.



Erasmus+ Programme

You can **work part-time** when abroad, as an EU citizen, you do not have any work-related restrictions



Automatically eligible for the **Erasmus Grant** – approx. €350 per month, paid in three instalments while abroad. If in receipt of the **SUSI Maintenance Grant**, you receive an additional €250 per month.



You are responsible for finding accommodation. We can put you in touch with past MU students or others from MU going to the same area.



Costs, Funding & Accommodation





Approximate cost for the US/Canada is \$18000-\$28000. Other locations can vary considerably.



You can work part-time when abroad but check your visa conditions. US visa allows you to work 20 hours per week on campus, Canada 20 hours per week on or off campus, Australia can work off campus.



Do not receive the Erasmus grant but you can apply for a scholarship.



You are often, but not always, guaranteed on-campus accommodation



Costs, Funding & Accommodation





You can still apply for **SUSI** for your year abroad.




You will register for your year abroad with MU before departing and **pay your** fees as normal to Maynooth.

Some host universities can have extra administration charges such as a library fee.



You are responsible for having the appropriate **<u>Travel Insurance</u>** before going abroad.


Our Global Partner Universities

You will find partner information on the <u>Global Partner Listing</u> and on our partner university websites in the International or Study Abroad sections.
 - Read the Outgoing Student Exchange Handbook for guidance on all aspects of studying abroad.
 - Review the Erasmus Charter for important academic and administration information.
- Read the <u>Exams Results Policy Document</u> to ensure you understand the implications of exams results on studying abroad.
- Attend an Information session hosted by the International Office during October & November 2023- dates to be confirmed.
- Contact your <u>Department International Coordinator</u> for information on academic requirements and advice on which universities might be best suited to you.
- Connect with MU students who have gone abroad in previous years or students from partner universities who

Getting Started





 Complete an Expression of Interest Form which will be available on the website from <u>15 November 2024</u> until <u>1 December 2024</u>

 You can submit an Expression of Interest Form for both the Erasmus + Programme and the Study Abroad Programme

- Choose up to 5 partner universities for each programme in order of preference
- It is only an Expression of Interest not an application. The Expression of Interest Form **cannot be amended** after submission.
- Expressions of Interest are **reviewed after the deadline** and not on a first come first served basis







- The International Office allocates places based on first year results, suitability of subjects/ choices and advice from your academic department
- We cannot guarantee that you will get any of your choices, and you may be offered **alternative destinations** if available
- If you have been allocated a place, the International Office will email you to confirm. Once confirmed, we submit your nomination to the host university usually from February to May
- The host university will email you to complete their application
