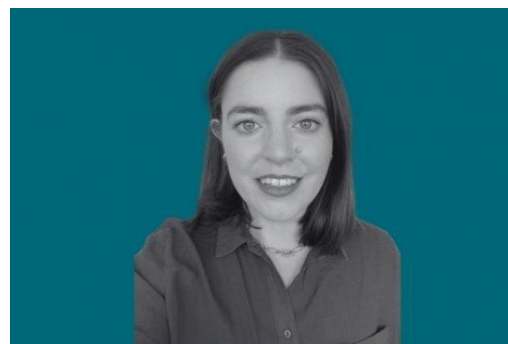

We provide careers education, information, advice and guidance to current Maynooth University students from first year undergraduate, through to postgraduate and to recent graduates.

Careers Information, Advice & Guidance

The Careers Information, Advice and Guidance work of the Careers Advisory team within the Careers and Employability Service is based on an adaptation of the Law and Watts model of Career Planning. The model has shown itself adaptable in the face of a constantly changing world of work largely due to its emphasis on the individual at the center of the Career Planning Process.

The Model comprises 5 broad stages through which the client can progress, and re-visit as needed. The key to this model is the step-by-step approach used in working with students, which allows us to support each student, at their own pace, as they take the next steps in finding their unique path.

Self-awareness – In this context this means the individual seeking to know and to understand their own personal development, what motivates them, their interests, strengths and abilities, what they can bring to the world (personally and professionally).

Opportunity awareness – an understanding of the world of work, career possibilities, potential and alternate pathways.

Decision-making and planning – developing an understanding of our individual decision-making styles and an awareness of how to explore influences, make career decisions, set goals.

Taking Action – Having or developing the appropriate level of skills to move career planning to action and reality.

Evaluation/ Review – an ability to assess and evaluate where we are in our career plan and to revisit some/all of the previous steps as necessary throughout our career.

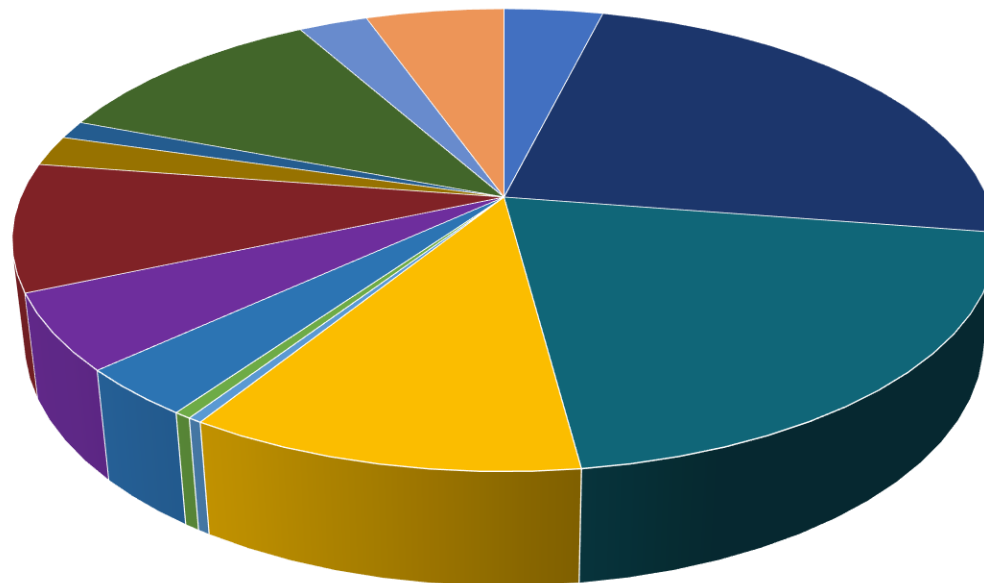

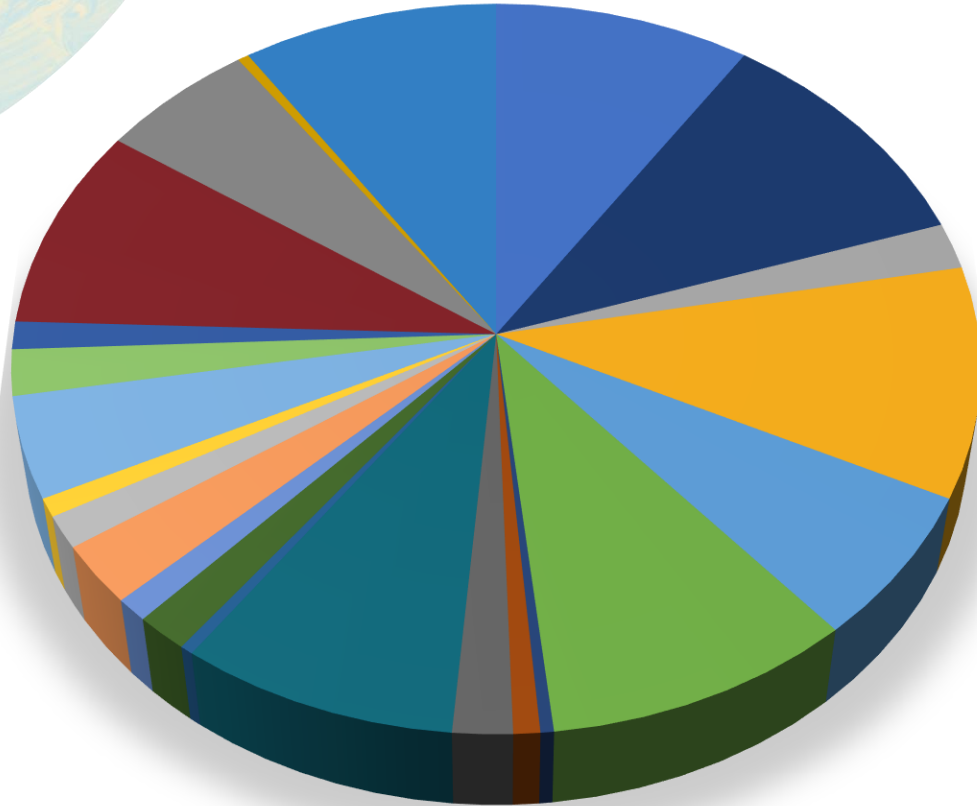

Summer Programme for Undergraduate Research

SPUR is an active research based and paid experiential learning programme for undergraduate students who wish to learn more about the postgraduate experience and possibly pursue a career in research. Held for six weeks (full time) or twelve weeks (part time) during the summer, it affords students the opportunity to work closely with faculty mentors on research projects across a range of disciplines, offering an academically enriching environment and exposure to a myriad of learning and research opportunities.

Micro-internships give students the opportunity to contribute to defined student success projects or activities within the University, enabling them to enhance employability skills whilst collaborating with Professional Services offices and staff. Micro-internships are paid roles whereby students work closely with a mentor in a professional service within Maynooth University.

Skills for Success Module

Skills for Success is a 5-credit elective module open to 2nd year undergraduate students which can be taken in semester 1 or 2. Students are encouraged to develop a strong sense of self-awareness, as well as enabled to identify and develop a range of employability skills. Topics covered on the module include Self-awareness, Job Search Strategies, Application Preparation, Interview Skills, Assessment Centres, and Leadership Skills.

We are dedicated to **enhancing students' career readiness** and ensuring **high-quality placement opportunities**.

Accredited Placement

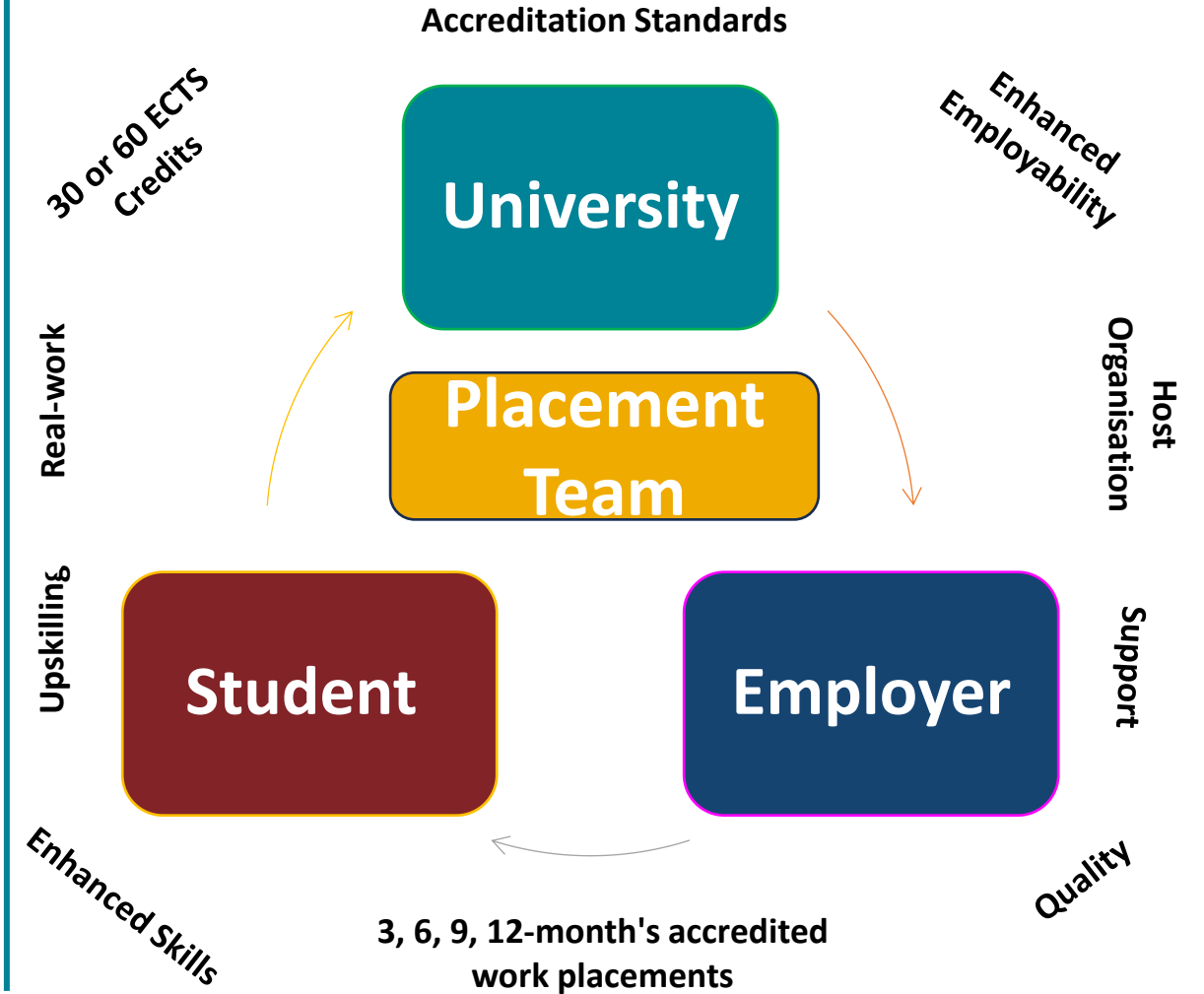
Accredited Work Placement is the bridge between academic learning and industry-based experience worth **30 to 60 ECTS Credits**.

The Placement Team ensures the quality and consistency of the programme, by:

- **Managing Industry Partnerships:** Securing high-quality placement opportunities that align with students' academic disciplines and career aspirations.
- **Providing Student Support:** Offering tailored guidance, coaching, and preparation to help students navigate the placement process.
- **Upskilling and Career Readiness:** Facilitating placement workshops, CV reviews, and interview preparation to enhance students' readiness for professional environments.
- **Coordinating Placements:** Ensuring placements meet accreditation standards, including compliance with academic requirements, health and safety protocols, and pre-employment screenings. We oversee logistical operations, including student-placement matching, contract management, Erasmus+ Traineeship grants processing.
- **Evaluation and Feedback Management:** We manage evaluation processes after placements, gathering insights to assess programme effectiveness and support continuous improvement.

Student Success Ambassador Programme

This year the Student Skills and Success Team hired 7 Student Success Ambassadors. These ambassadors were an integral part of the work carried out by the Student Skills and Success Team; promoting our services, hosting information stands, attending University open days, testing online resources and providing feedback and contributing to the all-student e-zine. These ambassadors were provided with training and a developmental plan to enhance their transferable skills. This programme was managed by the Careers and Employability Service and funded by the THRIVE Initiative's Student Engagement through Partnership (StEP) Fund.



CAREER ESSENTIAL SERIES

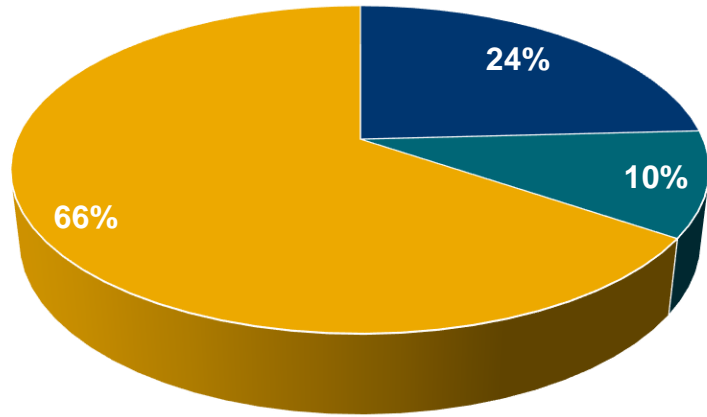

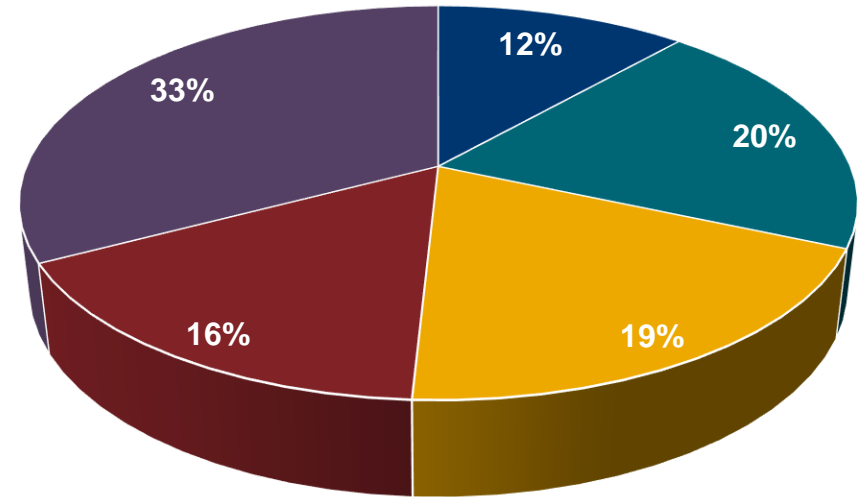
