This infographic relates to the information provided to university staff by students on their experiences of teaching and learning.



Why give feedback on teaching and learning?

Fuel change – highlighting issues can improve teaching and learning for you and for future students.

Think actively – providing feedback encourages you to assess what is important for your own learning.

Shape the future of the University – by providing frequent feedback you can encourage ongoing partnership between staff and students at Maynooth.

What you should expect:

Feedback might be requested from you in a variety of different ways.

There will be safeguards to ensure confidentiality.

Your feedback will be responded to.



Feedback tips.

Be specific – Give examples of what is working well and what you would like to see changed.

Avoid personal comments – Focus on the teaching process not the person teaching!

Share your ideas – What changes, small or large, could be introduced?

As a student you are in a unique position to provide feedback that will really improve teaching and learning!
