Fintan is the Professor of Nursing and Founding Head of the School of Nursing at Maynooth University. He is a registered General and Intellectual Disability nurse, with extensive experience of nursing across a number of fields of practice. Much of his work has focused on the rights and wellbeing of people with intellectual disability within both Irish and global health contexts. He has also sought to address the issues which impact such wellbeing. He has led the mental health component of the IDS-TILDA research project for several years as well as the development of a national group focused on the human rights of persons with intellectual disabilities in Ireland, which brought together many local and national groups and individuals with intellectual disabilities.

Petra Björne, with a MA in philosophy and a PhD in cognitive science, works as a research and development coordinator at the Department for Disability Support in Malmö, Sweden. Her task is to help staff and managers to develop high quality support within a strong rights-based legal framework.

As a researcher she is affiliated with the universities in Lund and Umeå, Sweden. In her research she focuses on expressions of distress, so called challenging behaviours, and organizational drivers of the use of restrictive and coercive measures in response to such behaviours. She is also interested in the more subtle, everyday restrictive practices impacting self-determination, independence and participation.
