Teaching Styles

Mode of Teaching	Definition	Class Size
F2F	Face-to-face (on campus)	Under 50
B1	Blend of face-to-face and remote (face-to-face sub-group workshops <u>and</u> remote pre-recorded lectures placed on moodle)	50+
B2	Blend of face-to-face and remote (face-to-face sub-group lectures. No pre-recorded lectures; lectures are live streamed and recordings of these are placed on moodle)	50+
R	Lectures and workshops delivered remotely (no face-to-face/ on campus delivery)	50+

On-Campus/ face-to Face (F2F)	Lectures on campus to groups of under 50.	In general, most lectures will also be recorded and placed online (on moodle). The usual materials that would be on moodle for the module will be there (e.g. reading lists, weblinks, slides, etc).	Attendance at the face-to-face lectures on campus. Accessing recordings that are placed on moodle. Use of Moodle to access materials, Q&A etc.
Blended Version 1 (B1)	The class size exceeds 50, and students are divided into subgroups, attending at different times/ on different weeks. Lecture materials are <u>pre-recorded</u> (via panopto) and uploaded to moodle. The lecturer meets the sub-group face-to-face for workshops/ discussion of online materials.	Lectures and other course materials will be provided online. Some workshops will also be recorded and placed online (on moodle). The usual materials that would be on moodle for the module will be there (e.g. reading lists, weblinks, slides, etc).	Attendance at the face-to-face workshops on campus. Following the lectures and other course materials provided online. Use of Moodle to access materials, Q&A etc.
Blended Version 2 (B2)	The class size exceeds 50, and students are divided into subgroups, attending at different times/ on different weeks. Lecture are <u>not</u> pre-recorded; they are <u>live streamed</u> from the lecture hall to the rest of the class (via panopto). They will be recorded simultaneously (via panopto) and uploaded to moodle.	Lectures and other course materials will be provided online, but lectures will be recorded as they happen (on campus). The usual materials that would be on moodle for the module will be there (e.g. reading lists, weblinks, slides, etc)	Attendance at the face-to-face lectures on campus. Following the lectures and other course materials provided online. Use of Moodle to access materials, Q&A etc.

Remote/ no on-campus element (R)	None	<p>Lectures and other course materials will be provided online (e.g. video/ audio recordings, narrated slideshows, etc)</p> <p>The usual materials that would be on moodle for the module will be there (e.g. reading lists, weblinks, slides, etc)</p>	<p>Following the lectures and other course materials provided online.</p> <p>Attendance at online meetings for discussion, clarification etc.</p> <p>Use of Moodle to access materials, Q&A etc.</p>
Modules with Tutorials (T)	Some tutorials will be offered face-to-face (on campus) in the usual way (about 50% of tutorials).	Some tutorials will be offered online (e.g. via MS Teams; about 50% of tutorials).	Details on how tutorials will be organised to follow in the coming weeks.
